Blissful newlyweds Shelly and Trent revel in their hectic NYC life until Trent is suddenly transferred to London. Dreaming of weekends in Paris and Rome, Shelly gives up her dream job (and favorite Cajun restaurant!) to follow her heart.

But expat life isn't as BBC as Shelly anticipated. Trent's work consumes him, there's not a decent jalapeño martini to be found, and Shelly finds herself waiting for her husband, her work visa, and for their new life together to start. Abruptly, Shelly realizes that she isn't stuck on the treadmill of life; she's waiting to get back on it.

Through humour and poignancy, WAITLESS probes the strains and joys of expat life as Shelly loses her identity and purpose, only to rediscover them in a most unexpected way.

The Edinburgh Fringe Festival production was directed by RADA graduate, NAACP "Renaissance Man, and featured Edinburgh Fringe veteran & Teapot Award for Outstanding Theatre Performance winner Jessica Moreno and Hollywood Fringe Producer's Pick winner Andrew Boyle.



Hailing from LA, *Waitless* is a semi-autobiographical play about newlyweds Shelly and Trent, from the American south but living in New York. Trent works in finance and Shelly in TV production, but when Trent's job transfers him to London, Shelly gives up her career to go with him. Told through heightened, contemporary farce with moments of sincerity,

Waitless shows that the cultural gap between the UK and US is bigger than you think.




